



HUMAN REPRODUCTION

Activity: Human Reproduction Role-Play

Objective: To understand the process of human reproduction and the roles of male and female reproductive systems.

Materials:

1. Large sheets of paper
2. Markers or colored pencils
3. Handouts explaining the male and female reproductive systems
4. Optional: Models or diagrams of the male and female reproductive systems

Procedure:

Introduction:
